

















### Conjunctions

Pair the words with the pictures. Laminate the pictures and words and then pair them; or glue the pairs on the construction paper. Ask your student to pair the words with the pictures. Present a picture to the student and ask "What is it?" – Apple, and display the apple on the table. Present the second picture and ask "What is it?" – Banana, and display banana on the table with a space between. Place **and** between the pictures, and ask the student "What is it?" point to the pictures while saying - apple and banana. Use prompts until the student master this drill, then fade the prompts and repeat the drill.
