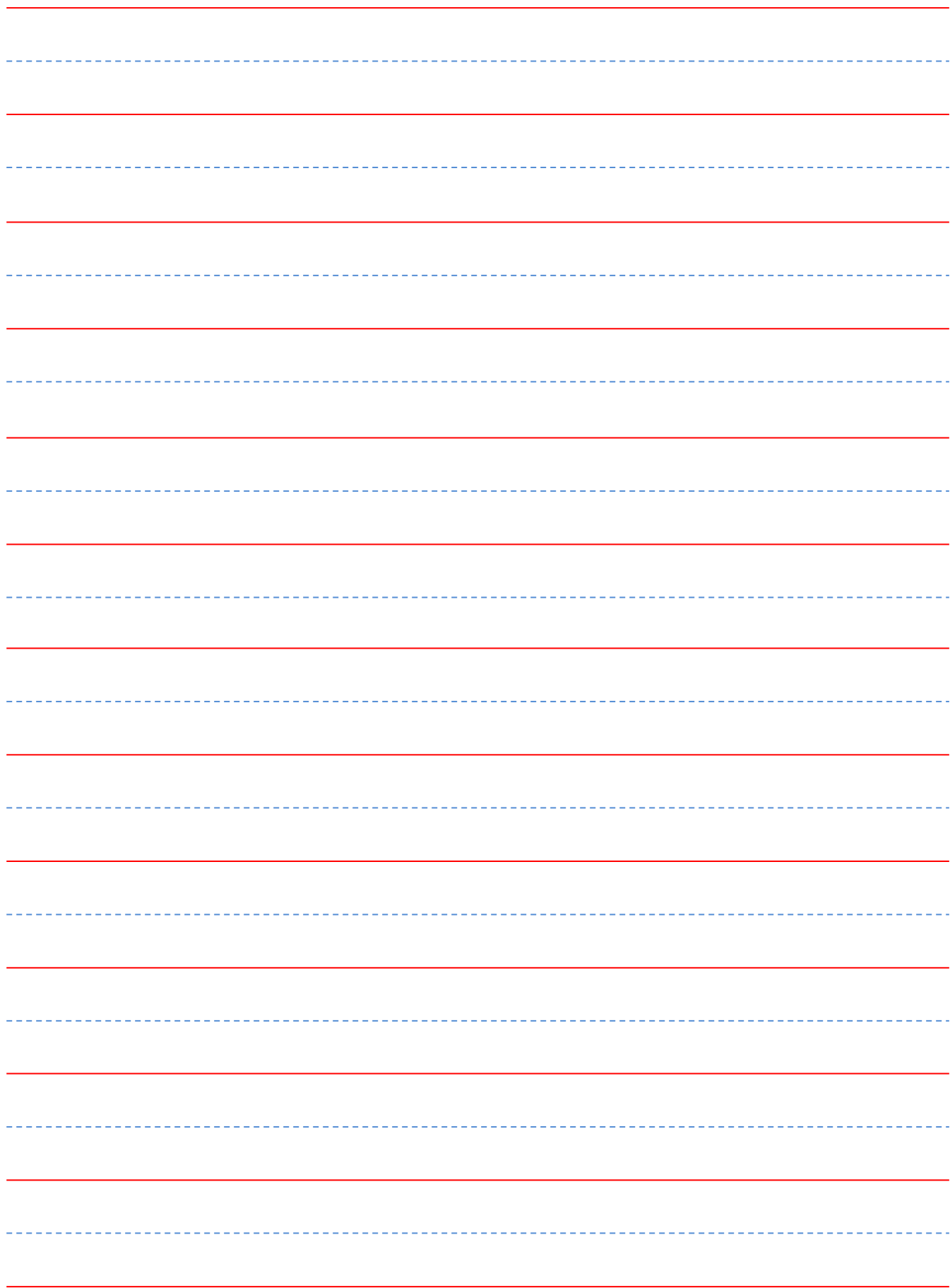
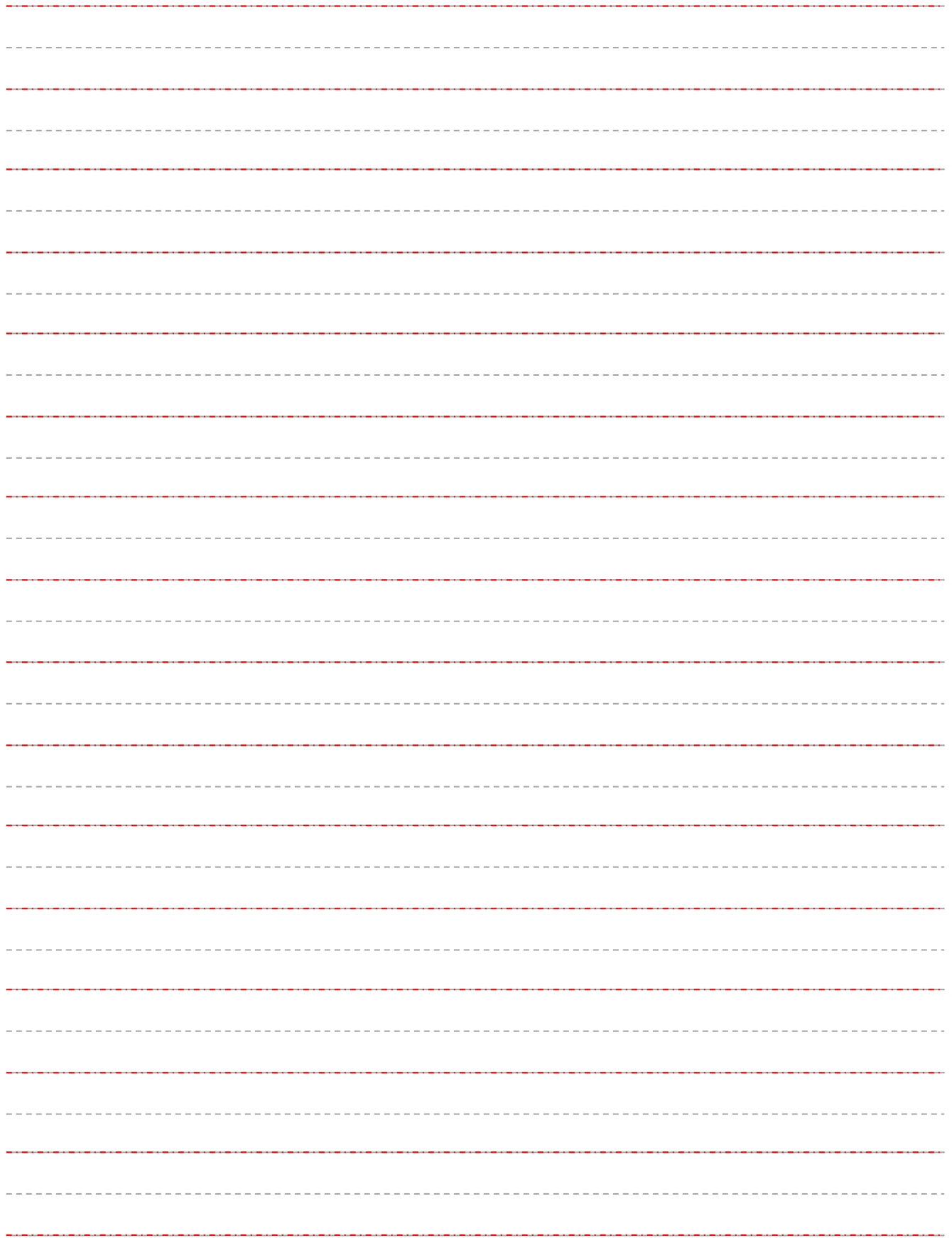


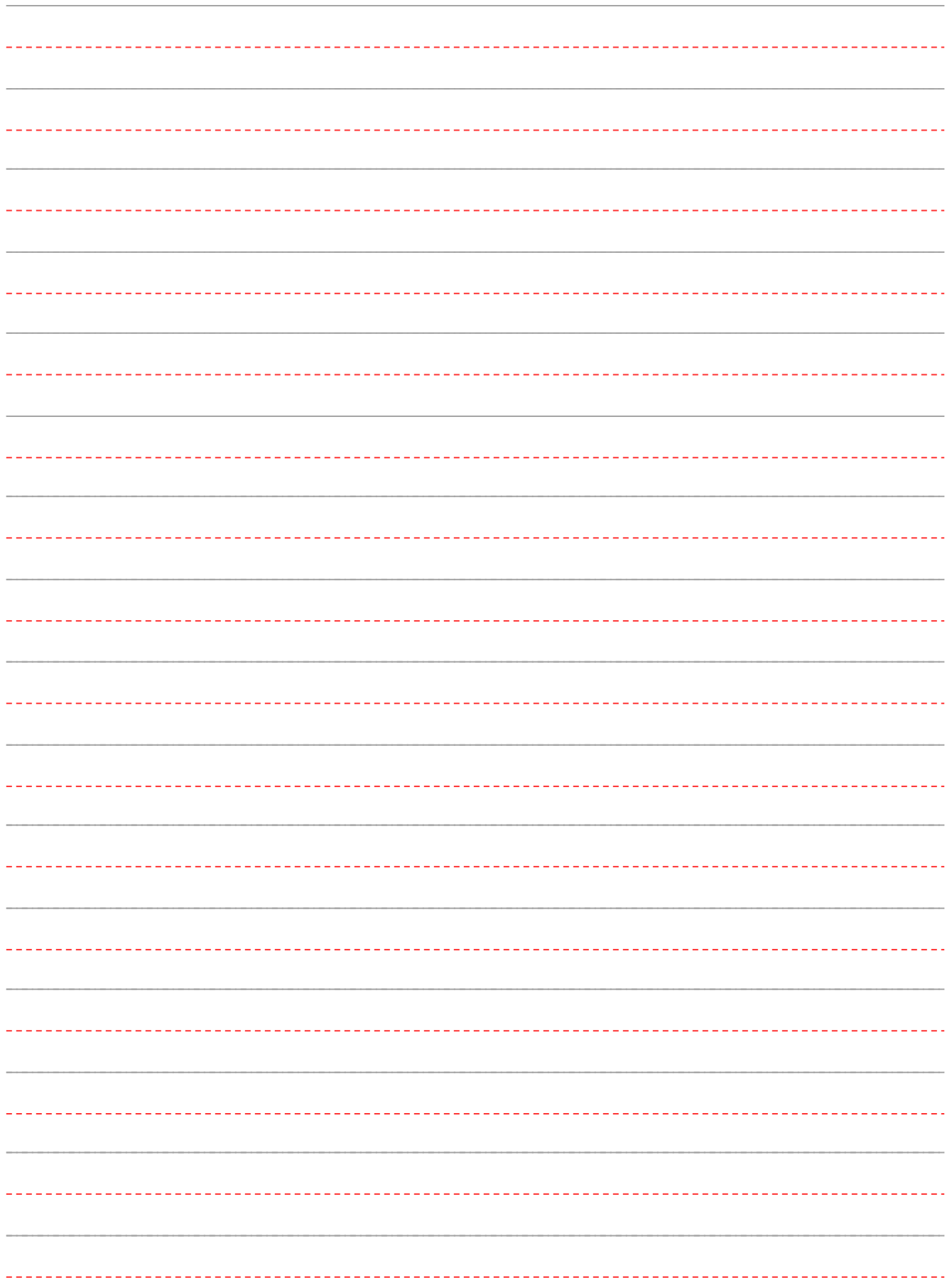

Before learning to write it is very important that the student learns how to hold a pencil correctly. It is also important that the student mastered tracing lines, tracing letters and tracing words to gain pencil control skill before writing sentences. Once the student mastered pre-writing skills, then use these prompted lines to teach the student where to begin and to end writing a letter. Prompt your student to start printing a capital letter and a tall letter from up red line to all the way down to red line. For the lower case letters, prompt the student to begin writing from the dotted blue line to all the way down to the red line. If the child has difficulty to understand how to print the lower case letters, use the red dotted line paper. Prompt the student to begin writing the lower case letters from the red dotted line to all the way down to the blue line. Once the student mastered writing between the prompt lines ask him to use regular paper lines (grey lines) to write.
